Describe your actions. Encourage your child to describe actions.

- Ask questions about the pictures: What does a gorilla say? What does a lion say? Where do you think the animals are going? Do you sleep in a bed? Do animals sleep in beds?
- Labeling: Label the balloon, flashlight, keys, and other objects. Name the animals. Label eyes, ears, mouth, etc. Label the dark and light.
- Counting: Count the animals as they walk in the house. Count how many animals are in bed and how many are on the floor. How many people are in the bed? Count body parts.
