 - Babies – particularly diapers and wipes






CARING CONNECTIONS

This program provides valuable opportunities for people of all abilities to participate fully in Jewish life. It leads the Twin Cities Jewish community in becoming a more inclusive and welcoming space, where all people with disabilities have the opportunity to participate in Jewish educational, spiritual, social and recreational activities.

- > Make Shabbat in a Box kits – either decorating (box, challah cover, Kiddush cups etc.) and/or raising funds to purchase the kit supplies



PJ LIBRARY

This international award-winning program is designed to strengthen Jewish identity by sending Jewish-content books and music on a monthly basis to children from age newborn through 8 years. Any family with a Jewish connection is invited to participate.

- > Sponsor the Shabbat in a Box kits used at Community Shabbats in the Park each summer.
- > Encourage donations to reach more kids (each subscription costs \$80, shared equally between JFCS and the Grinspoon Foundation)
- > Little Free Library Read and Color program – funding opportunity



RESPOND TO HUNGER
